## FORMER OLYMPIAN MILL WINS 2ND FLATS EVENT

Andy **Mill** of Boca Raton has won his second major Keys flats tournament in one week. The **former** Olympic skier and husband of tennis great Chris Evert was grand champion of the ninth annual Outback Steakhouse Golden Fly Invitational Tarpon Tournament on June 25 in Islamorada.

**Mill** released five tarpon and weighed two for a total of 2,715 points. He was guided by captain Paul Tejera.

Pat Ford of Miami was runner-up with one release and two weighed tarpon (including the tournament's largest) totaling 2,020 points. Ford's guide was Capt. Tim Hoover.

**Mill** also won the Seaguar Gold Cup Tournament that ended June 20.

\* Miller Time's Dan Russell won the month-long Competition Tackle Dolphin Round-up that concluded June 30 with a 45.67-pound dolphin.

Vic Puma aboard Lucky was the runner-up with a 35.62-pounder. Bob Stull on Hammerhead was in third place with 33.68.

\* Gonzalo Planas' team aboard TCB won \$4,000 for catching the heaviest dolphin, a 31-pounder, in the South Florida Inner City Games Tournament on June 21-22. Al Barreto's Intensity won \$1,000 for the top kingfish, a 13.6-pounder.

\* Miamian Tom Franklin is among 15 sailors named by the Olympic Sailing Committee of US SAILING to the 2003 U.S. Disabled Sailing Team. Franklin will compete in the 2.4 Metre class in the 2004 Paralympic Regatta in Athens, Greece, following the regular Olympic games.

\* Miami's Robert Berg was the winning skipper in the J/109 PHRF class in the Storm Trysail Club's Block Island Race Week in Rhode Island, June 23-27. Berg skippered Love That Chicken.

\* Wiring problems top the list of causes of fires aboard boats, according to a new study by BoatU.S. Marine Insurance. AC/DC wiring and appliances accounted for 55 percent of boat fires in a two-year analysis of claim files.
